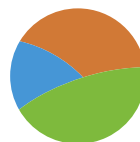
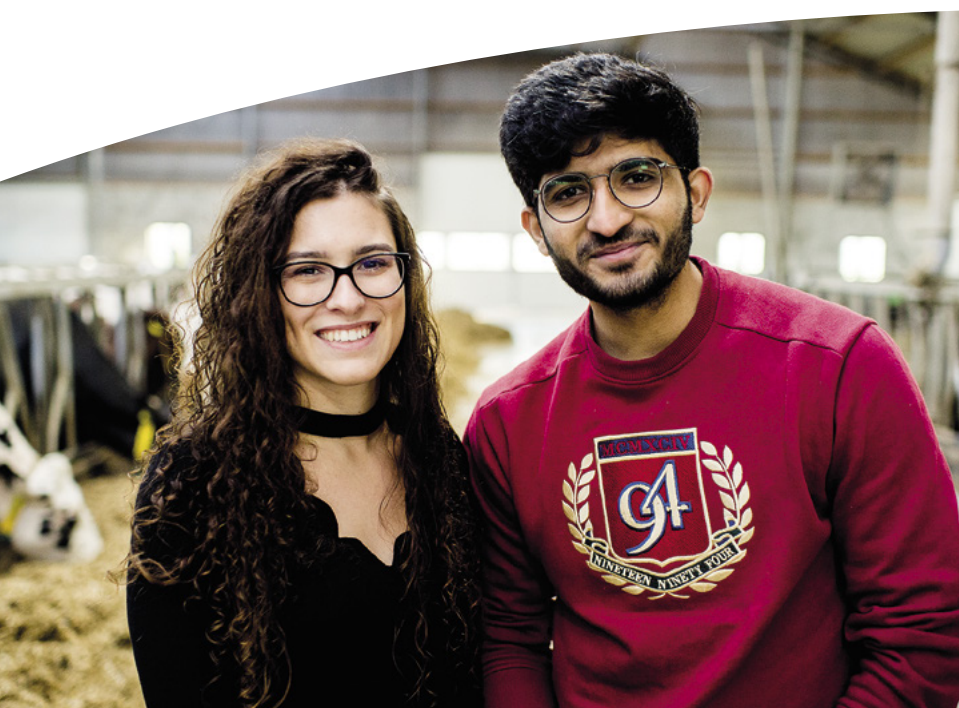

A secondary school diploma is required, which is equivalent to the Dutch HAVO diploma, e.g. International Baccalaureate diploma or A-Levels. It is highly recommended your diploma has a final examination in chemistry but this is not a mandatory admission requirement. You need to prove your English proficiency by providing a certificate issued by selected language institutions (TOEFL 80/IELTS 6.0 or other equivalent certificates).
